Spalding Special Schools Federation (Being renamed 'Tulip Academy Spalding' in September 2022)



CONSULTATION REPORT

The consultation window opened on Tuesday 1st March 2022 and closed on Sunday 27th March 2022

The Proposal

The Priory School and The Garth School in Spalding are officially merging in September 2022 to become Tulip Academy Spalding. The Community Inclusive Trust (C.I.T), in collaboration with Lincolnshire County Council (LCC), is commencing consultation on the proposal to permanently expand the capacity at Tulip Academy Spalding.

This proposal is to permanently expand the agreed number on roll at the school from 177, to a new capacity of 202. Pupils will continue to be based across either the Priory or Garth School sites. Additional teaching and resource space will not be required to enable the school to accommodate this increased capacity. However, the Priory School is part way through significant capital improvement works which will improve the condition and suitability of that site.

The proposed implementation date for the increased number on roll capacity would be 1st September 2022.

The Consultation


For this consultation C.I.T Academies direct mailed 95 stakeholders. This included all schools in the area, local councillors and MPs.

The Trust also sent letters directly to all staff, and parents and carers of pupils currently attending The Priory and The Garth schools.

The Feedback

More Details

Three people attended the face-to-face event. No questions were raised. All wished to submit their feedback via the online consultation feedback form.

The Trust received one query via email:

Q - Can I enquire as to the anticipated effects this proposal (assuming its accepted) will have on staffing please? Will it simply be an increase in numbers or are there wider reaching ideas about how the pupil increase will be accommodated?

A - Thank you for your enquiry. Due to local demand, pupil numbers at The Priory and Garth Schools have risen steadily over the past few years and 202 pupils are now educated across both sites. The DfE require schools to gain approval when numbers on roll exceed 10% of the number stated on the funding agreement. The funding agreement for Priory/Garth stipulates 177. This proposal essentially seeks agreement to maintain numbers at 202. There are no staffing increases or decreases required to maintain this number on roll. If not approved by the DfE, there could be a need to reduce numbers on roll, over time, to 177. This outcome could potentially create a staffing reduction requirement. Therefore, we are hoping for a positive response to the proposal.
